By standardizing our processes across all facilities, we strive to exceed industry standards through uniform care and transparency.

A Crucial Foundation

Understanding cattle behavior is crucial to our success. We train our team to move cattle with calm, low-stress techniques specific to our three plants' systems and equipment. For example, the Dodge City facility uses a Bud Box with a rectangular pen and an alleyway leading to the chute at a right angle. This gives cattle a path that makes them feel like they're going where they want. It's safer and lower stress for both employees and cattle.
